Over the past five years Bolster Community have been working closely with families, many who have children with mixed ability and they told us of their frustrations at finding clubs and activities that all their children could attend and how exhausting it was running from one to another. We spoke with the National Lottery Community Fund about what parents were asking us for and were delighted when they agreed to fund this project. This will offer out of school clubs and activities, where parents/ carers can leave children safely to have some fun and burn of built up energy whilst they enjoy some much-needed respite.

I believe that early intervention is key to the success in tackling health inequalities. Through this project parents and children will have easier access to evidence-based programmes such as Friends Resilience, Parents Plus, Incredible Years and Teen Resilience. Research shows that programmes of this nature help improve relationships and build resilience in children and families before they reach breaking point. We will encourage parenting mentors, who will undertake training in facilitating evidence-based programmes and work alongside other parents to sign post, advocate and support them to be the best they can.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome my new colleagues Gemma and Catriona who will be working alongside me as Community Play workers. Together we will be planning and delivering a busy schedule of events and look forward to meeting lots of you and your children over the coming months.

I would also like to thank The National Lottery Community Fund for their continued support and funding of this project which is very close to our hearts.

The parents of disabled children keep telling us about the difficulties of managing the logistics of a day out when you have a disabled child in your family. A trip to the park or a picnic at the beach is rarely doable as they try to balance the needs of children of mixed abilities, transport and having enough adults to child ratio to ensure everyone stays safe and has fun. They are frustrated and guilty that their children cant enjoy what others take for granted and siblings are missing out on fun family time.

We listened to what they were saying and early in August we booked buses, put on staff, and headed of to Mount Panther petting farm for what one little boy called .."the best day ever". The weather was definitely on our side that day, with the sun splitting the trees. Sunscreen on, our families set off on their adventure, enjoying the barrel ride, play parks, the pedal carts and meeting goats, llamas, rabbits, snakes and deer.

Whilst Covid-19 restrictions meant we were only able to facilitate 22 children and their parents we think the pictures tell the story of what was "the best day ever"
