YOUTH UPFRONT FINALE

On Saturday 5th June 2021, young people from across Newry, Mourne and Down came together to celebrate the completion of Youth Upfront. All seven District Electoral Areas (DEAs) of Newry, Mourne and Down were represented in the programme, with young people travelling from as far as Saintfield, Kilkeel, Castlewellen, Downpatrick and Crossmaglen to participate.

This Cross-Community Project has been funded by the EU's Peace IV Programme and was managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB). The Youth Upfront Programme provided a unique opportunity for young people to come together, make friends from different backgrounds and develop their leadership skills over six months. Bolster Community staff accompanied the young people to Carlingford Adventure Centre for an action-packed day filled with canoeing, zip lining, archery, wall climbing and attempting Ireland's largest wooden maze. Some of our more adventurous staff members even braved the cold depths of Carlingford Lough to join in with the activities! After enjoying dinner at the SkyPark, the prize giving ceremony commenced where we reflected on the success of the programme and each participant received a certificate of completion and a goodie bag before being whisked away for the evening activities.

After many, many months of Zumba, cooking and chatting over Zoom, BEST Club finally got to play together again in person! The group have been meeting weekly in Newry Gateway Centre where we have been able to offer a wide range of activities including arts & crafts, football, cooking, play dough and free play.

BEST Club Activity Club Leader Jena Henning said, "It's great that we can finally meet up for fun and activities! We are able to provide an opportunity for the children to meet up and socialise face-to-face after being limited to Zoom sessions for so long. Parents have reported that their children look forward to BEST club every week and they welcome the weekly break."

Over July and August the programme will be extended to include day trips and longer sessions to help parents and children enjoy the long summer break, which can be particularly difficult for families where there is a child with special needs.

The Best Club is funded by the National Lottery Community Fund and aims to offer children with additional needs and their siblings fun afterschool activities in an inclusive setting.

Over the course of 6 months, the young people met regularly via Zoom. The end-of-programme trip was the first time the young people had met each other face-to-face which added to the excitement of the day!

The programme aimed to strengthen the leadership skills of young people, while promoting the values of inclusion, awareness of identity and tolerance. During the weekly workshops, participants have been inspired to be the best version of themselves that they can be.

The Youth Upfront project has been a huge whirlwind of active and reflective challenges and the celebration day in Carlingford was definitely a fitting end to an extremely valuable & successful programme delivered during very challenging times! We're proud to have provided a catalyst for change in young people who fancy themselves as future leaders and yet we know that this has been a positive experience for everyone involved. Allison Slater, Operations Manager at Bolster Community reflects, "Seeing young people come together for the first time face-to-face to celebrate their differences was amazing. It really showed us how far we've come in terms of cross-community relations in Northern Ireland. Throughout the workshops, and especially today, we witnessed how insightful and hopeful of a shared future our young people are."

At the end of the project, we asked participants what they would like the future to look like. Some of the comments included:
"I hope we develop as a country and bring more equality into our communities"

"That I can grow up without ever having to face the sectarianism and danger my parents faced when they were my age."

"A more interactive and inclusive environment for the future generation"

" A future where young people have more of a voice politically."

Today I've met really cool people my age. We're planning to meet up again next week.' I already knew Catholics and Protestants work well togetherthis trip has confirmed that we can realise our differences and overcome adversity together.'

'I was inspired by the guest speakers Grainne McCoy and Ryan Cinnamond. Hearing how they have overcome personal challenges has made me realise my strength.'











Through group work, the girls bonded over shared experiences of peer pressure, bullying and self esteem issues and the focus was always on how we can overcome these hurdles in life. Every week we focused on topics such as Communication, Identity, Relationships and Goal Setting. When Amy was diagnosed with cancer and became too unwell to look after her nine-monthold daughter, she stayed awake at night worrying about childcare. Her husband Francis

was forced to work full time to support the family which barely kept their bills paid and meant that paying for childcare wasn't an option. As the young family had recently relocated to Newry and had no family living nearby, Amy contacted the Family Support Hub in dire straits.

The next day, a Family Support Worker from Bolster Community set out to meet with Amy at her home and carried out a holistic assessment. After many tears, hugs and phone calls to local organisations, Amy's Family Support Worker managed to secure childcare for Amy's daughter.

Although we're not able to take away Amy's condition, intervention from the Family Support Hub means she is now able to focus on receiving cancer treatment and resting without the added strain of childcare.

There are families in NI who are facing very challenging circumstances. Our goal is to make it easier for families to get the support they need at the earliest possible point.

FRIENDS for Life returns to schools!

Our FRIENDS Resilience team has been busy delivering 5 programmes to local schools between April and June 2021.

Funded by the Southern Health and Social Care Trust, FRIENDS for Life builds resilience, develops social skills and equips children with coping skills for dealing with emotions and feelings. The programme has reduced anxiety for children throughout the Newry and Mourne area for the past three years, giving participants the tools to rise to life's challenges. Through the programme, children aged 7-11 have been supported by promoting confidence, ability to focus, capacity to relax and regulate emotions.

As the weather has improved greatly, some of the children from Killowen Primary School, Rostrevor have been able to enjoy their sessions outside, getting in touch with nature, which I think we'll all agree, beats sitting in a classroom all day!

Community Navigator Pilot Scheme a flying success!





Our Navigator Hub based within Bolster Community worked in partnership with the Housing Solutions Team Leader and local organisations over the last few months to provide practical solutions to 197 people who were a risk of homelessness. Through the scheme, support has been provided with helping families organise financial support, access health services, sort accommodation and access education.

Bolster Community CEO Jacinta Linden reflects, "We're delighted with how the pilot project has developed in Newry and Mourne and we look forward to evaluating the outcome of the pilot. The Community Navigator Homeless Prevention Project was an amazing opportunity to bring together local resources & partners to prevent homelessness at local level. This project has been exemplary in showing how Partnership working joins up the dots and improves outcomes for all."

"If Bolster Community hadn't have worked with us my son would not have been living here now as I could not have gone through another year like the last one. With their support we now communicate better, I adapted a calmer parenting approach and my son is getting support with his issues."
