



#### WHAT A YEAR IT HAS BEEN!

This must have been the fastest year on record! Seems like yesterday I was writing the Christmas 2021 Newsletter & here we are saying goodbye to 2022 & hello to 2023.

It's been a year of challenge & change, we have drawn heavily on the goodwill of our funders, partners, board & staff to ensure we provide the best possible support for our local communities. It's hard to capture all that has happened over 2022, we have sadly said goodbye to some very valued Home2Hospital service users & also shared the joy in ringing the bell at the end of treatment for others. Our Home2Hospital volunteers continue to inspire & impress all of us at Bolster, and we hope to continue to meet the demand for extended service throughout 2023.

Overall, the big theme this year has been the Cost-Of-Living Crisis and Poverty in Northern Ireland continues to provide a challenging context to our work.

Michael Marmot in the New Statesman article October 2022, reports that rising prices are making us ill. The UK is headed towards a "significant humanitarian crisis with thousands of lives lost and millions of children's development blighted", he and his team at University College London (UCL) have warned in their most recent report on fuel poverty. As I look back at our work over 2022, I'm glad we have been able to support growing referrals for services & support but also to acknowledge very clearly that our partners, board & staff team did so with dignity & respect. Marmot refers to how the increasing cost of living crisis has caused people to feel a loss of "dignity". If you can't afford to feed your children, you can't lead a life of dignity," he says. "If you have to beg the landlord for relief because you can't pay the rent on Friday, that's a threat to dignity." This "struggle" to make ends meet has a direct impact on people through stress and its physical and mental health effects.

We have also witnessed the impact of government austerity policies & health inequality amongst local people. As a lack of affordable housing has taken its toll, we have watched growing numbers of local people at risk of homelessness seek help. Our Star Bites 57 Cafe in Marcus Street funded by the NIHE has extended to three days a week & continues to support those most at risk of homelessness. Parents, children, older people come to get advice, food and a listening ear. At Star Bites 57 Joanne, Sarah, Tracy & Justina provide a safe warm place where conversation flows, and children play & chat oblivious to the pressures & concerns faced by those who frequent the cafe.

We are glad to play our part, children as we know cannot benefit from services that do not exist, neither can those crippled by

anxiety, worry or debt. We need a government, we need multi-year budgets and we need the framework to enable our people to move from poverty to wellbeing and have a chance at realising true potential.

One of the highlights of 2022 is the success of the "Autism" Connect" pilot, championed by the Southern Health and Social Care Trust partners Noreen McCumiskey, Dr. Ivor Crothers, Dr. Liz McMonagle & implemented by the fabulous Orla Flinnighan & Sarah Fox at Bolster Community. Thursday nights will never be the same! Read more below in the update and don't forget, The Autism Connect guys have found their tribe & there will be no stopping them in 2023!

We have welcomed some new Bolster Buddies to the Social Enterprise candle making team this year & look forward to providing more opportunities to other adults with additional needs over 2023. Thanks to Jenna, Noreen, Kathy, Paula & Joanne for keeping the show on the road.

The celebration event was full of laughter and an opportunity for fellow volunteers to catch up. A highlight of the night included the screening of a short film produced by Bolster Community which featured service users expressing their gratitude for the Drivers in their own words.

### POSITIVE IMPACT OF FRIENDS RESILIENCE PROGRAMME AS DELIVERED FOR MACE

Bolster Community have recently published an 'Outcomes and Impacts' report which looked at the impact of the FRIENDS resilience programmes that were delivered across various schools from Jan to Sept 2022 through the MACE contract.

The FRIENDS Programmes are a suite of Australian developed, cognitive behaviour therapy (CBT) based programmes designed to build lifelong resilience in individuals, families, schools and communities. Bolster Community became a licensed provider for FRIENDS in Northern Ireland in 2017. We then won a contract under the MACE project (Multiple Adverse Childhood Experience).

This is a project which aims to transform lives through the provision of nurturing support within communities. Under MACE we delivered 23 FRIENDS programmes to 524 children in 17 schools across 3 counties and 2 Health Trusts. Results were extremely positive with 92% of children reporting they feel their confidence and self-esteem had improved and 100% of teachers stating they would recommend the programme again. We are looking forward to the continued rollout of FRIENDS to schools across the locality.

What a year it's been for Autism Connect! Our pilot programme has taken an astonishing metaphorical flight beyond what we, here at Bolster Community, could've hoped for. Every Thursday evening, our group meet for tea/coffee, board games and a chat. Our casual social hub creates the perfect atmosphere for making friends, as well as promoting individual wellbeing. But don't get me wrong, it's not all about the coffee and custard creams!



Autism Connect offers sign-posting and support services if needed, as well as outdoor excursions, day trips, guest speakers and various inclusive activities that enable us to support opportunities for connection, employment and orientation support. Our current members have given us the warmest and most positive feedback, a truly priceless Christmas gift to all of us here at Bolster Community. From all of us, we offer everyone involved a sincere and heartfelt thank uou.

One regular attendee said of Autism Connect that; "We have waited too long for this. I strongly feel it is exactly what we have all been waiting for." From our Christmas capers to our new year adventures, there's plenty to keep everyone at Autism Connect busy. Throughout December, we plan on helping our dedicated Bolster Buddies by making more of Bolster's iconic ACORN candles, as well as creating Christmas crafts. # Bolster Hosts Wellness Day for St Joseph's Boys High School Students

On Tuesday 20th September 2022 Bolster Community brought together local youth organisations to St Joseph's Boys High School, Newry for 'Your Youth Your Wellbeing'- a full school day filled with motivational speeches, wellness workshops & resilience challenges.

The day was for Year 8, 9 & 10 and aimed to engage boys aged 11-13 on wellness, positive mental health, motivation and self-care.

Activities on the day included Mental Health and Self Care Coaching from PiPs Hope and Support, Keeping Safe and First Aid Workshop from SHSCT, Physical and Social Confidence Workshop; Drink and Drugs Awareness Session and the most popular sessions of the day, Outdoor Physical Session from Pathways. A special mention to The Magnet Centre, Newry, who kindly donated 250 hygiene packs for each student to take away. Closing up the day, Funk Soul Media brought a creative rap workshop. Some enthusiastic students were invited on stage to have a go at shooting their own rap video with equipment such as Sony cameras, drones as well as microphones. This was a chance to show alternative employment paths for young people in NI.

Tracy, Training & Development Manager at Bolster Community commented, "With the increasing rise of mental health issues in young men we were delighted to host a full wellbeing day at St Joseph's Boys High School."

There were lots of smiling faces while the young men engaged in a full line up of interactive activities for the day. The young men soaked up the words of inspiration from our guest speakers. They learnt about body language and the importance of standing tall and how to present themselves to the world, the value of staying connected to family and friends and promoting self-confidence. "An all-round brilliant day!", one of the students told Tracy.

# INPATIENT DEMENTIA SERVICES CONSULTAITON

The Southern Health and Social Care Trust has launched a three month public consultation on the future provision of Inpatient Dementia Services in the Trust area.

- The proposed future service model would see the creation of a specialist inpatient dementia unit within the Bluestone Mental Health unit on the Craigavon Area Hospital site.
- The Southern Trust had a stand-alone inpatient dementia assessment and treatment
  unit on the Gillis Ward, St Luke's Hospital, Armagh. In May 2022, patients in Gillis Ward
  were relocated to Willows ward, Bluestone Unit, Craigavon Area Hospital as an interim
  contingency arrangement to ensure patient safety and quality of care when dedicated
  Consultant Psychiatry cover could not be secured.
- The consultation opened on 3 October 2022 and closes on 23 December 2022.
