

Lives. Real Stories exhibition

"The Right Place" Conference Sparks Hope for Autistic Adult Housing



On Thurs 22nd May, we gathered for "The Right Place Conference" - an event which brought together parents, housing specialists, support organisations, local authorities, and advocates to tackle one of the most pressing and underaddressed issues in the neurodivergent community: where and how autistic adults can live fulfilling, independent lives.

Hosted in an atmosphere brimming with warmth, collaboration, and energy, the conference was a powerful platform for discussion, connection, and shared vision with one parent sharing, "This event makes me hopeful about my daughter's future...for the first time, I don't feel so alone navigating these challenges."

Attendees had the chance to engage directly with service providers, developers, and care specialists. Topics ranged from supported living models and funding pathways to inclusive design and tenant rights. In response, professionals offered insight into innovative housing approaches, including cohousing communities, tech-assisted independence, and transitions from residential care into more autonomous living environments. Deputy Lord Mayor Councillor Kyle Savage addressed the conference, emphasising the need for inclusive, collaborative planning. "Housing is more than bricks and mortar - it's about dignity, independence, and the right to thrive," he said.

"This isn't just about housing. It's about belonging." Feedback was hugely positive with many attendees expressing a renewed sense of hope, solidarity, and direction. "This isn't just about housing," said one speaker. "It's about belonging. It's about saying: you deserve to live somewhere that feels like home."

While the day brought valuable connection and insight, it also underscored the gaps in current housing options, which often fail to meet the complex needs of autistic adults. There are no easy solutions, but the event sparked a shared commitment to finding inclusive, responsive approaches.

WHAT'S ON OFFER?

The Building Futures team in Newry, Mourne & Down and Armagh, Banbridge & Craigavon have a range of programme options. You might want to start with our 'Discovering Potential' Resilience & Wellness programme. The perfect place to start if you are feeling a little unsure of what you could do - and will give you the tools, resources and insights you need to develop better self confidence, self-esteem and resilience, all in a welcoming and supportive environment.

ELIGIBILITY

- · To be eligible you must be 18yrs old or older.
- Currently unemployed (i.e. have not worked in the last 4 weeks and not available to work in the next two weeks); and not on benefits with a Work Search element.
- Reside in Newry, Mourne & Down or Armagh, Banbridge & Craigavon.

We also welcome applicants from priority groups such as the over 50s, those with a long term disability or those living in remote, rural communities.
